
Expanding Our Horizons

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

AMSA 60th Pre-Health Fair

The Medical Degree in China program was exhibited at this year's AMSA 60th Annual Pre-Health Fair held in Anaheim, California at the Disneyland Hotel. The fair held approximately 300+ students that were seeking health related professions and were allowed to meet with various prominent Medical Schools.

Upon hearing the details of the Medical Degree in China program, the advisors of University of Nevada Las Vegas and San Diego State University invited Beth Healthcare to recruit students from their schools. In addition to this breakthrough, AMSA's International Region Director of Africa and Asia spoke with Beth Healthcare's president, James Hu, about the possibility of setting up an AMSA Chapter at China Medical University. This means that students will be able to stay informed and connected to other medical students.

Changes with the USMLE

The passing score for the USMLE has been changed from a score of 75 to 78. Even so, most competitive disciplines of the Hospital Residency program are requiring scores in the high 80's or even in the low 90's in order to be considered a serious candidate. In addition to that, students are NOT allowed to retake the exam to improve their score once they receive a passing score.

California Medical Board and NCFMEA

Due to regulation changes in California early this year, English programs are mandated to apply for separate recognition from the medical school. Beth Healthcare has been working with consultants that are endeavoring to complete the process of acquiring the recognition needed so that graduates of the Medical Degree in China program are able to practice in California. Students graduating from this program will not have issues getting licensed once they pass the USMLE and will be able to practice in other states regardless of the California Medical Board's (CMB) recognition. However, since Beth Healthcare is based in California, one of its main goals is to ensure that students from California will be able to return and practice in their home state. The application process will begin immediately, once the new application form is issued by the CMB.

Federal loans will also be a possibility in the future, as Beth Healthcare is working with authorities in China on being accepted by the NCFMEA. Once the process is complete, students in the program will be able to apply for U.S. federal loans.

U.S Professors to Teach at CMU

Beth Healthcare met a UCLA medical professor at the AMSA dinner, who expressed great interest in teaching at CMU. The program is looking forward to arranging for a U.S. professor to teach at least one core curriculum course each quarter.
